1. Look at Mrs Giggs in your join in magazine on page 4. There you can see how many children she has in her class. Mrs Giggs teaches class 3A. Another teacher teaches class 3B. There are 42 children in classes 3A and 3B. How many children are in class 3B?

2. Half of the children in Mrs Giggs' class 3A walk to school. 3 children go by scooter, and the rest take the bus. How many children take the bus to school?

3. It's sports time! Mrs Giggs' class is learning basketball today. Anna gets 4 points, Theo gets 2 points, Jana gets 29 points, Samuel gets 18 points and Mila gets 17 points. Put the points in order from the lowest to the highest. Start with the lowest.

4. Look at your join in magazine on page 5. Mrs Giggs' class goes on an excursion to the library. One child borrows 3 books, one child borrows 2 books, another child borrows 4 books and Mrs Giggs borrows 15 books. How many books does the class borrow in total?

1. In your join in magazine on page 7 you can see the Eiffel Tower and the Leaning Tower of Pisa. The Eiffel Tower is 330 metres high. The Leaning Tower is 57 metres high. How much taller is the Eiffel Tower than the Leaning Tower?

2. Look at the Schönbrunn Palace on page 7. The palace has many rooms. A very big room in the palace, the Great Gallery, is 43 metres long and 10 metres wide. What is the perimeter of the Great Gallery?

3. Jennifer and her family walk all around the garden of the Schönbrunn Palace. They walk 3000 metres total. How many kilometres do they walk?

4. Jennifer's family wants to go inside the Schönbrunn Palace. She has two parents and one sister. Her parents pay €32 each. Jennifer and her sister pay €23 each. How much does the family pay?
